

# SMOKE ALARMS & HOME ESCAPE PLANNING

Fires have drastically changed over the last 30 years. They are now burning hotter, faster, and are more poisonous than ever before. This is attributed to the modern plastics, glues, and hydro-carbon-based products that we have in our homes. Individual items throughout the home combust more quickly, which causes flames and smoke to fill rooms at a faster rate.

#### **SMOKE ALARMS**

Did you know that if a fire starts in your home you may have as little as two minutes to escape? During a fire, early warning from a working smoke alarm can be the difference between making it out alive or not.

- Are your smoke alarms older than 10 years? If so, it is time to replace them.
- Have you changed the batteries in the last 12 months? If not, it is time to replace them.
- Have you tested your smoke alarms? If not, it is time to test it.
- Do you have an adquate number of smoke alarms? You should have one on each level of the home, outside all sleeping areas and it is best if they are interconnected, so when one sounds, they all sound. Large homes need extra smoke alarms.
- Today's smoke alarms will be more technologically advanced to respond to a multitude of fire conditions, while mitigating nuisance and false alarms.
- Smoke alarms should be installed on the ceiling or high on a wall, always follow manufacturers instructions. Keep away from kitchens (at least 10 feet) to reduce nuisance alarms.

- People who are hard-of-hearing or deaf can use special alarms. The Canadian Hearing Society has more information on this.
- Smoke alarms are an important part of a home escape plan.

### HOME ESCAPE PLANNING

Fire can spread rapidly through your home, leaving you little time to escape once the smoke alarms sound. Plan ahead so everyone knows what to do and where to go if there is a fire.

- Draw a map of your home. Show all doors and windows
- Visit each room and find two ways out.
- All windows and doors should easily open so they can be used to go outside.
- Make sure your home has working smoke alarms.
- Pick a meeting place outside, it should be in front of your home. Everyone will meet at the meeting place in an emergency.
- Make sure your house number can be seen from the street.
- Talk about your meeting place with everyone in your home, including family, friends, and guests who stay over.
- If there are infants, older adults, or family members with mobility limitations, make sure someone is assigned to help them.
- Make sure everyone in your home knowns to dial 9-1-1 and knows the address.
- Practise your home escape plan on a regular basis.





# **SWIMMING LESSONS**



The Township of Muskoka Lakes offers swimming lessons during July and August at two locations:

**BALA** – Jaspen Park **MILFORD BAY** – Baycliffe Park

Lessons follow the curriculum of the Canadian Red Cross Swim Preschool, Red Cross Swim Kids, and the Lifesaving Society Lifesaving programs. All swim participants (exclusive of the Preschool Sea Turtle Lessons) must be a minimum of three years of age, toilet trained and not in diapers at the commencement of the swim program. Adult lessons may be available upon request.





- Clear vegetation and combustible material down to mineral soil and cover with non-combustible materials like gravel, brick, or concrete.
- Avoid planting woody shrubs or trees. If any are present, prune and maintain them regularly.







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# WHAT IS A SHORT TERM RENTAL ACCOMMODATION (STRA)?

A Short Term Rental Accommodation is the use of any part (or all) of a dwelling used for accommodation in exchange for payment for 28 consecutive days or less.

This does not include motels, hotels, resorts, bed and breakfasts, cabin rentals, tourist lodges or similar commercial or institutional establishments.

# Do you own or operate a STRA in Muskoka Lakes?

All operators must apply for a license by December 31, 2025 in order to operate a STRA in Muskoka Lakes. All operators can continue to advertise and operate without a license through 2025.

- Apply for License
  - Be prepared to submit: insurance, a site map, floor plan, photos, etc.
- Always Keep Limitations Top of Mind

  Be mindful of booking dates and occupancy limits. Rental restrictions come into effect May 1, 2026.
- Should You Contravene the By-law, License will be Revoked or Suspended
  If you receive 15 demerit points your license will be revoked or suspended

All STRA's in Muskoka Lakes will be limited to 2 people per bedroom. If an operator can provide sufficient evidence that their sewage system is properly equipped to service more than this amount, the Township may increase the maximum occupancy for the STRA on the issued license.
